

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- · Blue colored plastic Easter egg
- · Boots egg printable templates
- Scissors
- · Craft glue
- 1 sheet light blue construction paper
- · 1 sheet pink construction paper
- · Sharpie or fine-tip black marker
- · 4-inch blue pipe cleaner
- 1 sheet yellow construction paper, cut into a 1.5x6-inch rectangle
- · Stapler (optional)

Parent Tip

Using wooden or plastic eggs is a sure-fire way to avoid the breakies and the smellies. You know what we mean...



HOW TO MAKE

STEP 1

Print the face and ear templates. Trace the inner-ear templates onto pink construction paper and trace the ears onto light blue construction paper. Cut inner-ears and ears out from the construction paper. Glue the pink inner-ear pieces to the light blue ear pieces. Fold back the tab on the ears. Apply glue to the tab and press the ears onto the egg. Let dry. Fold back the tab on the head-topper. Apply glue to the tab and press it onto the top of the head. Let dry.

STEP 2

While the ears and head-topper dry, print and cut out the eye pieces and the face template. Trace the face template on pink construction paper and cut. Glue the eye pieces to the pink face piece. With a black marker, draw nostrils and a mouth onto the face piece. Then glue the entire face onto the front of the egg. Make the tail by taping the pipe cleaner to the back of the egg.

STEP 3

Curl the yellow rectangle into a ring and staple or glue it closed. Once all parts are dry (~½ hour), rest Boots on his stand!



Cut & Paste:



Trace onto Construction Paper:

Note: Snip notches on the tabs as indicated so that the tabs can adhere to a curved egg surface.
